# **American Nicaraguan School Service Cord**

The American Nicaraguan School is dedicated to creating and cultivating lifelong learners that can apply knowledge to service. We feel that through service, our students can become educated citizens that find value in contributing to a better, more peaceful world. In order to become well-rounded, young adults, students should approach service as an investment in the lives of others.

In order to receive the service cord, students are required to complete and document 150 service hours throughout their high school career. Our staff will help guide each child through this process, but ultimately, it is the responsibility of the student to document and record his/her service hours and reflections. It is important to note that travel time to and from the location does not count towards service hours. Only hours achieved through providing direct service should be counted. Documentation will occur through:

- ANS Service Activity Log
- Record and reflect in student e-portfolio (within 1 week of the service)

Service hours vary depending on grade level for this year only. In order to receive a service cord, students must document at least 150 hours over the course of four (4) years. Each service opportunity must be accompanied with a reflection or blog in the student e-portfolio. Students are only allowed to document 20 hours over each summer. Below is a chart for each grade and the hours required before graduation:

Grade Level	Hours Required
12 <sup>th</sup> Grade	50
11 <sup>th</sup> Grade	100
10 <sup>th</sup> Grade	130
9 <sup>th</sup> Grade	150

\*Hours listed above are the minimum for completion for our service cord. It is our hope that each student will approach service learning with a desire to do far more.
